LIGHTING OF THE PASCHAL CANDLE

Since Maundy Thursday, when the lights in this house of God were dimmed, we have lit the flame of the Paschal candle as a symbol to ourselves and to the world that the light of Jesus Christ can never be extinguished. On this Pentecost Sunday, the flame now grows brighter as the Holy Spirit joins with us to spread the light to everyone, everywhere.
