- The Stonington United Methodist Church asked for donations of soup from their congregation on "Souper Bowl Sunday". We received 4 boxes
- I request that the church of the month send 2 volunteers on Saturdays. A 3rd volunteer that could help outside with the Dollar General and Taylorville Food Pantry donations would also be welcome. Come at 8:00 and leave when finished. Be prepared to work without supervision and possibly do some cleaning or sorting of plastic bags. I will definitely need a volunteer to help outside on March 23rd when we distribute the

- Thank you to all our supporting churches for your donations of food, clothing, money, service as well as your prayers.
- Blue Mound Caseys have been donating items that are slightly out of date. They also donate items that they are not longer carrying.
- Blue Mound and Macon Dollar General Stores continue to donate items twice weekly. We have been getting several jugs of fresh milk and juices as well as lunchmeat and eggs
   even some frozen items!
- Both Dollar Generals has also been donating slightly out of date items.
   We have gotten a lot of staple items as well as snacks.
- We are again receiving large quantities of free USDA items from the Central Illinois Food Bank.
- I attended a workshop at the Central Illinois Food Bank in Springfield to learn how to use an iPad to register the clients (now called neighbors) each week. This will start when I feel comfortable with the process and the weather gets warmer.

- A donation of \$200 from the church of the month is requested to help share in the cost of rent, electricity, and pest control. Checks made payable to Interchurch Council.
- Easter is coming up quickly as it is at

  year. We will be giving out boxes of

  23rd so that there is time to thaw out
