New Volunteer Expecta ons

It was decided at our quarterly mee ng that star ng now member churches need to send <u>4</u> volunteers each Saturday instead of 2. One person that can lift boxes in and out of shopping carts and into cars. One person that can assist people with produce and table items. Both these volunteers will be out in any kind of weather and should dress accordingly. Two people to sort, prep items, etc. as you have been doing. Please park on Lewis Street on the west side of the building. You can enter through either the front or back doors. A dona on of \$200 from the church of the month is requested to help share in the cost of rent, electricity, and pest control. Checks payable to Interchurch Council.

We con nue to receive dona ons from the Taylorville Food Pantry, the Dollar General Stores in both Blue Mound and Macon, and from the Caseys store in Blue Mound. The Caseys store in Blue Mound and Dippin Mervs save boxes for me to pack food in for our neighbors.

Thanks to all the suppor ng churches and the individuals who donated items this last month. Jeff Mar n and Gary Neimeyer donated 2 grocery carts of sweet corn distributed July 13th.

Bayer in Stonington read my previous newsletter and decided to make the following dona ons: 24 backpacks and 15 boxes of facial ssue for the back-to-school giveaway, 16 bottles of dish liquid, 22 bottles of shampoo & condi oner, 3 bottles of liquid hand soap, 30 tubes of toothpaste, 4 bottles of laundry detergent, ___ bottles of an perspirant and 72 bars of soap.

The USDA has con nued to send large quan es of free commodi es over the past few months. We are now getting canned salmon and canned chicken. We are looking for people who can lift boxes to help with our deliveries from the Central Illinois Food Bank. These deliveries come on the first and third Mondays of each month around 9:00 am, except for holidays.

We have been using a large quanty of plast shopping bags like you get your groceries in at Walmart, Kroger, etc. If you can donate any clean bags without holes, it would be greatly appreciated. We are also staring to run out of canned vegetables. The food list from the Central Illinois Food Bank has been very limited lately, and I am having to shop at local stores for canned vegetables. We also con nue to need

items like shampoo, bar soap, dish liquid, laundry detergent, toothpaste, antiperspirant, etc. I try to give out one of these types of items each week as they are not covered by SNAP (formerly food stamps).

We will be giving backpacks and other items to school children in the Meridian School District and those living in Stonington on August 3rd and 10th. I have a volunteer for those days to take care of that for us. At present we have 59 backpacks. We served 57 students last school year, so it would be nice to have some extra for the children to choose from. The children are also given a box of Kleenex along with a Walmart gift card to use to shop for school supplies. Donations of backpacks and boxes of Kleenex by the end of July would be greatly appreciated.

The Jubilee Community Garden in Blue Mound is looking for volunteers to do any kind of work in the garden. Contact me with any questions, and I will put you in touch with the garden manager. Any students needing community service hours for school are welcome to volunteer. Your report forms will be filled out and signed for this requirement. The Jubilee Community Garden provides fresh produce to the food pantry throughout the entire growing season. The food pantry also gladly accepts donations of any excess fresh food you may have from your personal gardens. There is a big crop of blackberries this season. I have been buying 2 cup containers to put the berries in to distribute on Saturdays. Any donations of clean plastic 2 cup containers with lids would be appreciated.

The Macon United Methodist Church will be hosting Church in the Park at 11:30 AM on Sunday, August 11th. There will be praise music. Bring a picnic to share with your family. All are Welcome.
