LIGHTING OF THE SECOND ADVENT CANDLE—Love

Reader 1:

Blessing upon blessing has been showered upon us by God.

Reader 2:

The lame shall walk; the blind shall see; the deaf shall hear.

Reader 1:

There will be peace and hope in God's land.

Reader 2:

Be of good courage. Behold! God is blessing and redeeming us!

Today we light three candles. The first is the candle of Hope, reminding us to watch and wait for what God is about to do. [Light the first candle]

The second candle is the candle of Peace, enabling us to look at our lives, to get rid of all those things that keep us from God, to change our ways and live as God would have us live. [The second candle is lit]

John replied to them all, "I baptize you with water, but the one who is more powerful than me is coming. I'm not worthy to loosen the strap of his sandals.
