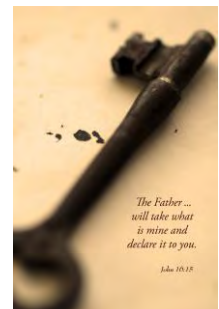
PRAYER OF CONFESSION (unison)
